The heat was not as bad as in the past, but still made the event less than perfect


for the critters. However, the participants all enjoyed the evening and Rev. Dimick's sermon.

TECHNICAL GRANT AWARDED

The Preservation Trust of Vermont awarded the West Fairlee Center Church a matching grant for \$250 from the Robert Sincerbeaux Fund. These funds, unavailable last year, will be used to hire the services of George Turner, an architect with Banwell Architects in Lebanon, NH.

Turner will prepare a full report of preservation or restoration options for the building along with his recommendations. These may require some decision-making on the part of our membership.

The report will also include a schedule or sequence of what tasks need to be done in what order, and will become an essential part of our application to the Preservation Trust for funds next year.

We will continue to keep membership and friends informed of any plans, grant applications, or volunteer services needed. We want to ensure the church is standing for the next 150 years!

Each year as we send out this newsletter, we find more and more people who remember and love the West Fairlee Center Church. They remember community activities, people and services. There is a deep history of community and place.


