## **Ice Cream Social & Blessing of the Animals - 2021**

On Sunday, August 22 West Fairlee Center came alive with its annual Ice Cream Social and Blessing of the Animals. The Church and the West Fairlee Community Club jointly hosted this time-honored event at the crossroads of Middlebrook Road and Bear Notch Road. The lawn of the West Fairlee Center Congregational Church was ablaze with color and greetings. Nate's Sugar Shack served up old fashioned ice cream sundaes, maple frappes and maple cotton candy. Club servers added yummy chocolate and/or blueberry sauce, brownie bits, whipped cream, nuts, sprinkles, and cherries for the top.

Once the signal was given, the crowd gathered round to start the Blessing. The Reverend Jan Hustlar, minister of the Unitarian Church in Norwich, offered heart felt thoughts about how much we love our animals before she blessed each pet individually. The Serenata musical trio played music. Dr. James Hughes sang a cappella "Ole Shep" with a brave baritone voice that rang through the valley. Newcomers met neighbors and old friends greeted each other amid smiles and laughter. Memories and stories floated on the air.

## **Service of Gratitude - 2021**

The annual Service of Gratitude for 2021 was held by zoom on the Sunday after Thanksgiving with over forty people in attendance. We began as is traditional with the Haudenosaunee liturgy for gatherings, and then had a series of speakers and prayers from a wide variety of faith traditions.

Kyle Barrett said the Prayer of Contrition which marks this day as one of mourning for the lives of those natives peoples lost in the celebration of what settlers called "Thanksgiving." Chief Nate Pero of the Kowasak tribe responded. We then had short talks from Sensei Aaron Hoopes, of Dragon Mountain in Vershire, Cleo Kearns of the West Fairlee Center Church, Reverend Gregory Wilson of Vershire, Mohsen Mehdawi of West Fairlee, Deecie Denison of Thetford, Ann Cook of Thetford, and Cat Spalding of West Fairlee. Traditions from all over the world were represented, including the Buddhist, Taoist, Bahai, Islamic and Jewish lineages. People spoke of their own personal practices of prayer and devotion, and we prayed together for the earth and the wellbeing of all peoples.

This coming year we will once again begin our circuit around the elements with the 2022 Service of Gratitude to be held on Sunday November 27, 2022 at 3:30 focused on the theme of earth. Anyone who wishes to speak in the spirit of the occasion is welcome to ask if there is space on the program to do so. The format will be slightly different, as we will need to reduce the number of speakers in order not to go over time. ### **West Fairlee Center – An Important Historical Site**

The Congregational Church was designated as an Historic Site in 2002. Built in 1855, it typifies many characteristics of the Greek Revival architectural style. It is also significant in that members of its early church community, such as Nathaniel Niles, played important roles in the formation of the state and nation.

Nathaniel Niles is buried in the adjoining cemetery under a large pyramid shaped gravestone. Nathaniel Niles (1741-1828) was a Revolutionary War patriot and author of the popular ode "The American Hero," written in celebration of the Battle of Bunker Hill. Niles attended both Harvard and Princeton as a student in law, medicine, and theology. He was very talented and over the years he had been a teacher, minister, inventor, farmer, and one of the first two Representatives to the United States Continental Congress along with Judge and other civic duties. The cemetery dates back to the 1780s. At one time, the

cemetery had become overgrown but in recent year the Cemetery Commission has done an outstanding job of caring for this site.

The Clubhouse originally a brick one-room school was built in 1804. In the 1930s, the Mother's Club bought this abandoned dilapidated building for \$1 plus a promise to insure and maintain the building from the Town of West Fairlee. The Mother's Club was founded in 1918 and in many ways this building is a tangible symbol of the transitional role of women over the last 100 plus years. The Mother's Club is now the West Fairlee Community Club with a broader membership. The Clubhouse is undergoing some renovations and the challenge is to honor its history while making the needed changes. *More on the Clubhouse in the coming Newsletters...*
